# Conservation Management and Public Safety Enforcement FY 2008 Budget Modifications – February 2008

Request to increase Corporate Tax \$47,047.13 (Correcting original budget and adding in two additional Police Officers for the implementation of the Consent Decree)

**2480 Conservation Management:** Increase budgeted Corporate Tax monies \$38,772.41. This request will correct the wage of a Police Officer; the budgeted amount was incorrect because his wage changed when he passed his State certification. This will add in the two additional Police Officers (50% from here and the other 50% from Public Safety CC# 2580) for the implementation of the Consent Decree. There were also some adjustments to fringe based off of actual and some miscalculations from the original budget. The total change in wages and fringe is an increase of \$49,534.22. Gasoline costs increased \$4,500 for the additional travel associated with enforcing the Consent Decree. Indirect decreased \$15,261.81 with the decrease in the rate from 16.57% to 13.05%.

**2580 Public Safety Enforcement:** Increase budgeted Corporate Tax monies \$8,274.72. This request will correct the wage of a Police Officer; the budgeted amount was incorrect because his wage changed when he passed his State certification. This will add in the two additional Police Officers (50% from here and the other 50% from Public Safety CC# 2580) for the implementation of the Consent Decree. There were also some adjustments to the personnel sheet and fringe based off of actual and some miscalculations from the original budget. The personnel sheet change is that there are two Police Officers that are paid 50% out of a grant under Victim Services and when this budget was submitted it was not certain that Victim Services would receive the new grant award so the two Police Officers were budgeted for. At this time, the two Police Officers are being removed from the personnel sheet the 50% that the grant under Victim Services is paying. The total change in wages and fringe is an increase of \$29,017.43. Indirect decreased \$20,742.70 with the decrease in the rate from 16.57% to 13.05%.
