PROPOSAL TO CANCEL THE COST SHARE CONTRACT WITH USDA-NRCS FOR CONSTRUCTION OF A WALLEYE AQUACULTURE POND ON TRIBAL LAND

WHEREAS, in December 2005, the Tribe, through its Inter-tribal Fisheries and Assessment Program (ITFAP), submitted a pre-application to USDA-NRCS for the construction of a walleye rearing pond on tribal land near Barbeau, Michigan; and

WHEREAS, USDA-NRCS engineers provided preliminary pond construction design plans and preliminary cost share estimates that were incorporated into the contract; the Tribe's share was estimated at \$104,450; and

Office WHEREAS, the Board of Directors approved \$104,450 as the tribal contribution for the project on June 6, 2006, Resolution 2006-60; and

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WHEREAS, USDA-NRCS indicated that it would complete the final project design plans by Sault Ste. Marie December 2006; however, the plans were not presented to tribal staff, ITFAP, until March 2009;

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WHEREAS, the extended delay in finalizing the construction design plans, coupled with the 906.635.6050 substantial increase in expected cost to the Tribe, represents a material change in the circumstances with regard to the Tribe's existing contract with USDA-NRCS; and

WHEREAS, the Tribe is now undergoing financial restructuring and will therefore not be able to meet its financial obligation proposed by the substantially increased construction cost estimates (\$198,634).
