Any notice to cancel or terminate an agreement for the lease/purchase, use, or occupancy of a dwelling, or to leave a premise, must be in writing, and must be delivered to the tenant or landlord in the following manner:

(1) Delivery must be made by:

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(a) a law enforcement officer of the Tribe or an agency of the United Stated Government; or

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(b) any person authorized by the Tribal Court; or

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(c) any adult person.

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(2) Delivery will be effective when it is:

(b) personally delivered to an adult living in the premises with a copy delivered by mail; or

(c) personally delivered to an adult agent or employee of the landlord or the tenant with a copy delivered by mail.
