# PROCEDURES FOR APPROVING A SMALL MESH GILL NET APPLICATION

BE IT RESOLVED, an individual wishing to apply for a small mesh gill net permit shall do so pursuant to these procedures:

- 1. Applications must be made in writing to the office of the Executive Secretary to the Board of Directors. The Executive Secretary shall contact Law Enforcement who shall determine whether the applicant has on record: (a) a major infraction; or (b) has never received a small mesh permit before.
- 2. If neither (a) or (b) apply then the Executive Secretary shall place the application before the Board of Directors at their next regular or special meeting.
- 3. If either (a) or (b) apply then the Executive Secretary shall place the application before the Great Lakes Conservation Committee and:
- (a) The GLCC shall vote on an application pursuant to its rules of procedure.
  - (b) The GLCC may not approve an application per a phone vote.
- (c) If the applicant is not present the GLCC shall not vote on the application.
- (d) Before voting on an application Law Enforcement shall provide the GLCC documentation of event underlying the infraction.
  - (e) The Executive Secretary shall place the GLCC recommendation on the application before the Board at their next regular or special meeting.
- Any application approved contrary to these procedures shall be deemed void.

#### OPPOSING WASHINGTON REDSKINS MASCOT

WHEREAS, we, this Board of Directors of the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians are bound to endeavor to enlighten and educate the public toward a better understanding of Indian people, preserving our cultural values and traditions and promoting the health, safety and welfare of the Tribe and all Native Americans; and

WHEREAS, other Native American and civil rights organizations have called for eliminating the use of Native American mascots, including the National Congress of American Indians, the National Indian Education Association, Oregon Indian Education Association, the Society of Indian Psychologists, the Affiliated Tribes of Northwest Indians, and the US Commission of Civil Rights; and

WHEREAS, the findings of the American Psychological Association and the American Sociological Association that the use of Native American mascots and symbols and the use of stereotyped images of Native Americans within public schools to be offensive and harmful to all students; and

WHEREAS, the Oregon State Board of Education has enacted a prohibition preventing Oregon public schools from using Native American names, symbols, or images as school mascots; and

WHEREAS, the National College Athletic Association's has a record of encouraging educational institutions to refrain from using hostile and abusive mascots and prohibiting those institutions which insist on using such harmful and offensive images from appearing in NCAA tournament events; and

WHEREAS, the National Football League has historically had a commitment to challenging itself to improve and to be guided by values of integrity, performance and teamwork, tradition and innovation, diversity, and learning; and the NFL has a demonstrated commitment to honesty, support and celebration of cultural diversity; and a recognition of the individual responsibility required to learn, grow and develop both as individuals and as an organization; and

WHEREAS, the actions of the United States, in supporting the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples, recognizes the dignity and diversity of the cultures, traditions, histories and aspirations of indigenous peoples and calls for effective measures to combat prejudice, eliminate discrimination, and to promote tolerance, understanding and good relations between indigenous peoples and all other segments of society; and

WHEREAS, the National Museum of the American Indian has worked tirelessly to educate the public on the problems of racist imagery and cultural appropriation in American sports; and Res. No: <u>3013-34</u>2 Page 2

WHEREAS, stereotyped imagery, caricatures, cultural appropriation, perpetuating the myth of the savage whether noble or otherwise, and physically objectifying Native people regardless of gender is offensive, culturally insensitive, demeaning and damaging to not only our youth, our history and our culture but also that of the United States.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that we, the Board of Directors of the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians, respectfully call on the National Football Commissioner Roger Goodell, the owners, coaches and players of the National Football League to:

Require, that the Washington D.C. N.F.L. franchise shall change the name, logo and imagery associated with the current name and prohibit the sale or use of said name, logo and imagery in future N.F.L. games and events; and

Educate, N.F.L. fans, particularly in the Washington D.C. metropolitan region, as to the history, culture and current conditions of indigenous peoples in the United States and around the globe; and

Partner with, Native American tribes, scholars, athletes and educators to raise cultural awareness of Native Americans, increase understanding and tolerance and to work towards ending discrimination in all its forms.
